

Biography:

Born in Taiwan, Janice Wong began her piano training with her mother at the age of four. Her early music education in the United States started with William Ransom, Director of Piano Studies at Emory University. She completed her Bachelor's and Master's degree at the Peabody Institute of the Johns Hopkins University studying under Boris Slutsky, the chair of the Piano Department. Upon receiving her degrees, Ms. Wong competed and was awarded first prize in the Pro-Mozart Competition and was granted full scholarship to study at the Internationale Sommerakademie Mozarteum in Salzburg Austria under the esteemed pianists Andrzej Jasinski and Sergio Perticaroli. She furthered her studies under Zalina Guervich and Oleg Barsov, former professors at the renowned Saint Petersburg Conservatory in Russia.

Professionally, Ms. Wong was a member of the piano faculty at Emory University in Atlanta, United States for 11 years. During this period, she performed as a soloist and as a collaborative artist with the members of the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra. In addition to her position at the university, she was appointed as the audition chair of the Georgia Music Teachers Association in the 10th grade division and the district division. Her students had been accepted to music institutions across the United States, namely, Yale University School of Music, New England Conservatory of Music, Manhattan School of Music and other highly acclaimed music institutions. Ms. Wong currently lives with her family in Geneva, Switzerland, where she had completed her second Master's degree in Music Pedagogy from the Haute école de musique de Genève and is currently working toward her doctoral degree in Education at University of Geneva.
